have ever worked with dancing each night perfectly. Much interest in the company's work was established and we were delighted to perform to a whole new audience during the Festival.








BIOG -RA PHIES

DAVID BOLGER DIRECTOR, CHOREOGRAPHER,

David is the co-founder and Artistic Director of CoisCéim Dance Theatre. To date he has choreographed Dances with Intent, Reel Luck, Straight With Curves, Hit and Run, Ballads, Toupees and Snare Drums, Dish of the Day, When Once is Never Enough, Boxes, Rite of Spring, Mermaids, Swept, Chamber Made, Nutcracker and Out of Harm's Way. His work for CoisCéim has been seen throughout Ireland and in Europe, America and China. In 2001,

David co-wrote and choreographed the award winning film **Hit and Run** which won the Paula Citron Award for Choreography for the Camera in the Moving Pictures Festival, Toronto and the Jury Prize in the Dance on Camera Festival at the Lincoln



Centre, New York. He was also nominated for the American Choreography Award, LA. David's large scale work includes **A Dash of Colour** involving 75,000 people, for the Opening Ceremony at the Special Olympics held in Dublin [2003]; and **Intimate Details**, a dance spectacle based on the human and animal ornamentation of The Book of Kells for the Opening Ceremony of the Ryder Cup [Sept 2006]. As a freelance choreographer, David was commissioned to make **Ausserhalb der Gelfahrenzone!** for the Tanztheater in Freiburg/Heidelberg. He also works in both theatre, opera and film in Ireland and overseas. His Opera projects include: **Orfeo Ed Euridice** for Opera Ireland [2004], which won an Irish Times/ESB award for best opera before going on to open the Maifestspiele in Wiesbaden; His second opera for Opera Ireland, **Imeneo**, [2005] was also nominated for an Irish Times/ESB Award; For English National Opera,

he was Assistant Director/Choreographer on La Traviata and directed and choreographed A Midsummer Night's Dream at the Gaiety Theatre in 2008. Theatre projects include Sophie's Choice [Royal Opera House, London], Dancing at Lughnasa [TNM, Montreal], The Coast of Utopia, The Relapse, Love's Labour's Lost and Man of Mode [Royal National Theatre, London], Martin Guerre [Cameron Mackintosh, UK & USA], Pirates of Penzance [Guthrie Theatre, USA] Sive [Druid Theatre Company] and Big Maggie, Tarry Flynn, The Colleen Bawn and The Secret Fall of Constance Wilde for the Abbey Theatre. During 2005/06, David worked on many projects with Druid Theatre Company including Sive, The Year of the Hiker and on the entire Synge Cycle: The Tinker's Wedding, Playboy of the Western World, Riders to the Sea, Deirdre of the Sorrows, The Well of the Saints and Shadow of the Glen. Film Choreography includes Dancing at Lughnasa with Meryl Streep and directed by Pat O'Connor. Most recently, David directed the musical Macbecks for Longroad Productions. David is a member of Aosdána.



EAMON FOX LIGHTING DESIGNER.

Eamon studied Theatre & Lighting Design in The Samuel Beckett Centre, Trinity College Dublin. Eamon previously lit Boxes in 2000. Theatre lighting designs to his credit are Unravelling the Ribbon [Gúna Nua], Danti-Dan [Gallowglass], Moonlight Mickeys [Calipo], Yerma [QUB], Underneath the Lintel [Landmark Productions], The Half [Ransom Productions], Bailegangaire and An Triail [Aisling Ghearr] Foley [Corn Exchange], Hades and The Green Fool [Upstate Theatre] and Top Girls [Live Theatre Newcastle]. The Merchant of Venice, Macbeth, King Lear and Hamlet [Second Age], A Midsummer Night's

Dream and The Caucasian Chalk Circle [Peacock Theatre] and The Old Lady Says No! at The Samuel Beckett Centre. Talking To Terrosists, I Have Before me..., Five Kinds of Silence, Master Harold and The Boys and Stolen Child [Calypso]. Dance designs include RRR Kill to Infinity... and Fall & Recover for John Scott's Irish Modern Dance Theatre, Tearmann & Vespers for Fearghus Ó Conchuir Trigger for Project Arts Centre. Eamon has also designed Die Fledermaus for Co-Opera and the opening launch of the Sea Stallion exhibition in Collins Barracks.

Vincent and Ivan began a few years ago working on a collaborative basis. JYM DALY ANIMATION.

Beginning at the Crawford Municipal Art Gallery in Cork, Jym became involved in all aspects of local theatre from acting to set design. Making his first animation in super eight at this time, he received an award from the South Bank in London. After a one-man exhibition in the city, he found hanging art on walls far too limited in terms of expression and was attracted to the emerging world of performance art. He used all forms of media in those early efforts including film, sound, a goat's head and a household ladder. Forming a group which left to take on the bigger playing field of London, Jym attracted the attention of London's avant garde scene by playing kitchen sinks along with chinese violins in nightclubs such as Camden Palace. Never feeling any one art form to be fully satisfactory, he worked in several fields, from playing with music groups like **Psychic Tv** to acting with theatre groups such as Wet Paint whilst keeping a hand in the art world. Jym later found himself involved in the development of a new sound combining spiritual music from around the world with the emerging world of dance beats. **Loop Guru** toured the world for many years leaving a rich legacy of albums. Jym also created videos for the band and a cartoon which ran in a national music magazine. His eclectic artistic past now culminates in Fidget Feet aerial dance company, co founded with wife, Chantal McCormick where music, film, dance, acting and swinging boats off cranes co-exist peacefully in one expression.



JASON E. BERNARD PERFORMER.

Jason E. Bernard is a native of The Bronx, New York U.S.A. At the age of 17 he made his Broadway Debut in The Tony Award winning musical **Bring In Da Noise, Bring In the Funk**. Jason was featured as J. Bunny in the Spike Lee directed film **Bamboozled** and appeared in the Showtime Original movie **Bojangles** starring Gregory Hines. Jason has appeared on Broadway and Internationally with **Riverdance** in the showstopper **Trading Taps**. Jason is proud to make his CoisCéim debut performance in **Doddems**!

LEE CLAYDEN PERFORMER.

Lee graduated from London Contemporary Dance School with a 1st-class honours degree. In his third year he became a member of 4D,LCDS performance company where he worked over 2 years with many eminent choreographers including Mark Baldwin, Siobhan Davies and Wayne McGregor. He has worked with many dance companies including Ricochet, ENO, The Charnock Company, Companhia Portuguesa de Bailado Contemporaneo, Random Dance, Kerry Nicholls, Vincent Dance Theatre, Aletta Collins and the Richard Alston Dance Company, Scarabeus, Walker Dance Park Music and with Rafael Bonachela. Lee also performs aerial dance with Gravity and Levity and has played the messenger in Walk the Plank's S.W.A.L.K, among live pyrotechnics.



Film and TV credits include the **The Wizard of Earthsea**, **Finding Neverland**, **Frankenstein** directed by Michael Howells and Mark Baldwin, **Jaguar Cars**, **The Rite of Spring**, MTV and **Top of the Pops**. Lee was twice nominated for Outstanding Male by the Critics Choice Circle and for the Time Out Live Awards 2005. During 2007/08, he performed in the West End show **Lord of the Rings**. Previous performances in Ireland have been with Fidget Feet on **RAW** and with CoisCéim on **Dodgems**.
