David Bolger

choreographer

As Co-founder and Artistic Director of CoisCéim Dance Theatre, David has choreographed Dances with Intent, Reel Luck, Straight with Curves, Hit and Run, Ballads, Toupees and Snare Drums, Dish of the Day, When once is Never Enough, Boxes, Rite of Spring, Mermaids, Swept, Chamber Made and Nutcracker. In 2001, he co-wrote and choreographed the award winning film Hit and Run which won the Paula Citron Award for Choreography for the Camera in the Moving Pictures Festival Toronto and the Jury Prize in the Dance on Camera Festival at the Lincoln Centre, New York David was also nominated for the American Choreography Award, LA. As a freelance choreographer, David was commissioned by the Tanztheater in Heidelberg/Freiburg to make Ausserhalb der Gelfahrenzone! (Out of Harm's Way). For Opera Ireland he directed Orfeo Ed Euridice, which won an Irish Times/ESB award for best opera before going on to open the Maifestspiele in Wiesbaden; and Imeneo, also nominated for an Irish Times/ESB Award. In September 2006, he was Assistant Director for La Traviata for ENO before returning to co-choroegraph with Muirne Bloomer a dance spectacle, Intimate Details for the Opening Ceremony of the Ryder Cup. Other projects include Sophie's Choice (Royal Opera House, London), Dancing At Lughnasa (TNM, Montreal), The Coast of Utopia, The Relapse, Love's Labour's Lost (Roval National Theatre, London), Martin Guerre (Cameron Mackintosh, UK & USA), Pirates of Penzance (Guthrie Theatre, USA) Sive (Druid Theatre Company) and Big Maggie. Tarry Flynn. The Colleen Bawn and The Secret Fall of Constance Wilde for the Abbey Theatre. Film Choreography includes Dancing at Lughnasa with Meryl Streep and directed by Pat O'Connor. During 2005, David worked with Druid Theatre Company on the entire Synge Cycle including The Tinker's Wedding, Playboy of the Western World, Riders to the Sea. Deirdre of the Sorrows. The Well of the Saints and Shadow of the Glen.

Irina Pauls

choreographer

Born in Leipzig, Irina studied dance at the Palucca School Dresden and choreography at the Theaterhochschule Leipzig. She worked as Artistic Director and Choreographer at the Landestheater Altenburg (1985 - 89), In 1990 she was appointed as Director of the newly formed TanzTheater Irina Pauls at the Schauspiel Leipzig where she worked until 1998, creating 15 world premieres. From 1998 – 1999 Irina Pauls was Director of Dance Theatre at the Staatstheater Oldenburg. From 2000 - 2006 she was engaged with her Company at the City-Theatre Heidelberg which cooperates with the City-Theatre Freiburg. She also worked as guest choreographer at other German Theatres (Schauspiel Essen, Deutsches Nationaltheater Weimar, Bayrisches Staatsschauspiel München) and held several workshops in Germany and abroad (Athens, Kiev, Perm, Dublin), Irina Pauls is member of the committee of Internationales Theaterinstitut Deutschland

Matthias Engelke

After classical and jazz piano training Matthias Engelke worked in musical installation and composition in various forms. He became involved in computer generated and steered music early in his music career. During his university studies he founded and directed different interactive music projects including Unverwahrt, a project for the electronic instrumental band Subotnik. The band released its first album on the label Allscore in 2002. Matthias has composed the music for Irina Pauls' works Mit dem Feuer spielen (2001), Kafka (2004) and Schimmelreiter (2005).

Monica Frawley

set + costume design

Born in Dublin, Monica is one of Ireland's best-known theatre designers. She studied at NCAD Dublin and Central Saint Martin's in London and has worked in theatre in Ireland and the UK for more than 25 years. She has worked extensively with the Abbey Theatre, Druid and Rough Magic and for many independent companies in Ireland. Her design work includes Tom Murphy's The Gigli Concert and Marina Carr's By the Bog of Cats (Abbey), At the Black Pig's Dyke by Vincent Woods (Druid) and The Taming of the Shrew (Rough Magic). She has won the Irish Times/ESB theatre awards for both best design and best costume design, a London Time Out design award and a Guardian design award at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe for her work on Linda McLean's play Shilmmer at the Traverse. She has worked at the Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis and the Royal National Theatre in London. Opera design includes Orfeo ed Euridice, Imeneo and A Streetcar Named Desire for Opera Ireland. She was design consultant on the Special Olympics opening ceremony in 2003. Though she had directed experimental, visual theatre pieces with artist Gaby Dowling and designed and directed Dracula at Druid, King Ubu at the Galway Arts Festival fulfilled an ambition to create a piece of total theatre - visual and text based

Film work includes directing the dance film Hit and Run which won the main awards at both Dance on Camera New York and Moving Pictures Toronto and the Copplestone award for best first-time director of a feature film at the Celtic Film Festival; documentaries on The Dingle Wren's Day and The Berlin Years of Agnes Bernelle: and the concert films Celtic Woman, Brian Kennedy Live in Belfast and Ronan Tynan: The Impossible Dream for PBS. He was a television director with RTÉ for twelve years, where his numerous credits included The Eurovision Song Contest 1995. Nighthawks, Fair City, popscene, The Blackbird and the Bell. Theatre work includes set design, lighting and video for Hamlet (Peacock and Lyric Theatres) currently nominated for Best Lighting Design in the Irish Theatre awards; Mermaids (CoisCéim Dance Theatre); and Copenhagen (Rough Magic) for which he won Best Set Design in the Irish Theatre Awards. He has designed lighting for numerous Irish Theatre companies including the Abbey, Druid, Siamsa Tire, Barabbas...the company. Galloglass, Operating Theatre (of which he was also an artistic director) and two performance works by James Coleman. Work as director includes The Well (Abhann Productions) and Gavin Friday's Ich Liebe Dich, both for recent Dublin Theatre Festivals, and two years as Production Director worldwide of Riverdance - the Show (Abhann Productions).

Sinead's designs include Myrmidons Ouroboros, The Bacchae of Baghdad Abbey Theatre, Making History Ouroboros (winner of best costume design Irish Times Theatre Awards 2005); Amadeus Ouroboros (nominated Best Costume Design Irish Times/ESB Theatre Awards 2004); Dublin by Lamplight Corn Exchange (nominated Best Costume Design Irish Times/ESB Theatre Awards 2004), Macbeth Theatreworks/Second Age (nominated Best Costume Awards 2003); Mutability (winner of Best Costume Design Irish Times/ESB Theatre Awards 2000), Tales from Ovid and Richard III Theatreworks: ART Everyman Palace: Chamber Made CoisCéim Dance

Theatre; How Many Miles to Babylon (Winner of Best Costume Design, IrishTimes/ESB Theatre Awards 2005), King Lear and Hamlet, Second Age; Rudolf the Red, Pass the Parcel The Ark; The Woman who Walked into Doors Upbeat Theatre Co.; Midden Rough Magic; Guess Who's Coming to Dinner? She is on the board of management and the artistic committee of Ouroboros Theatre Company and is currently the Costume Director for the Samuel Beckett Theatre.

performer Muirne began classes with Jill Wigham and later trained at the Irish National College of Dance. She has performed with Dublin City Ballet, Vienna Ballet Theatre, Rubato Ballet, Irish Modern Dance Theatre, Dance Theatre of Ireland and CoisCéim Dance Theatre. She performed in Chamber Made which won a Fringe First Award at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival 2005. Muirne has assisted Artistic Director David Bolger on many

CoisCéim shows including Mermaids. Nutcracker and Opera Ireland's production of Orfeo Ed **Furidice** at the Galety Theatre and in Wiesbaden. Other choreographic work includes Winter (CoisCéim, 1998), Dandy Dolls (Peacock Theatre, 2004), Dancing at Lughnasa (An Grianán 2002 and Gate Theatre, 2004), and Mixing it on the Mountain (Calypso Productions 2003). She has directed parades for Macnas at the Galway Arts Festival and on behalf of CoisCéim. the Brighter Futures Project at the St Patrick's Day Parade, Dublin. Last September, she choreographed with David Bolger, Intimate Details for the Opening Ceremony of the Ryder Cup.

Mike studied theatre and performance at Colaiste Dhulaigh and Bull Alley respectively. He studied dance at the Gret Palucca School in Dresden, Since 2000, he works as a dancer in Ballet Schiadowski and Tanztheater Heidelberg/Freiburg with a number of different choreographers. This is his 12th production with Irina Pauls. He met David Bolger in Freiburg working on Out of Harm's Way in 2004.

Mónica Muñoz Marín Born in Barcelona, Mónica studied dance in the Institut del Teatre,



Barcelona and at the Folkwang-Hochschule in Essen. She has worked with Malou Airaudo and Jean-Leaurent Sasportes in Essen: Rodolpho Leoni Dance Company in Düsseldorf: Cie Toula Limnaois, Rui Horta and Helge Músial in Berlin. Since 2002, she has been working with Irina Pauls in Heidelberg and as part of the Heidelberg/Freiburg Tanztheater.

He worked as a dancer in Turin (1994), Florence (1998-99), Koblenz (1995-1998), Hildesheim (1999-2001), Freiburg 2004-06), Austria (Vienna 1997) and Switzerland (St.Gallen 2001-2003, Zürich 2003, Luzern 2004, Bern 2006) and as a teacher and choreographer. In 2004 under the direction of Irina Pauls in

Freiburg im Breisgau, Germany, Marco met David Bolger for the first time.

Since 1995, CoisCéim Dance Theatre has created and presented over twenty dance works ranging in scale from duets to larger ensembles. Based in Dublin, the company tours regularly throughout Ireland and internationally.
