Artistic Director David Bolger embraces a selection of dance styles to articulate stories and emotions that are relevant to the landscapes in which we live. The scale of the company's work ranges from duets in a hotel bedroom, *Chamber Made*, to the large scale spectacle *A Dash of Colour* (which was seen by millions on television and involved over 75,000 people for the opening ceremony of the Special Olympics, 2003). Touring, both nationally and internationally is a key part of CoisCéim. The company is a founder member of Dance Travels, a new network to develop audiences in Ireland and beyond. Internationally in 2014 the company's work has been seen at PEAK PERFORMANCES in the USA and most recently at Edinburgh Festival Fringe with *Missing*. The company also conducts an original and comprehensive artform awareness and participation programme through CoisCéim Broadreach.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

A family photo. A story beneath. It moves us.

We are all a bundle of relationships and families, unfolding in this shared world.

Each of us, a reservoir of memories. Our body is our confession, where these stories lie".

THE TIDES THAT BIND US started with a simple photo. Inspired by a workshop I took with Argentinian Theatre maker Vivi Tellas, I was curious to begin this project with a photo...a mysterious family photo. Coming into this new group of diverse group - family was something we all had in common; it was our common point of departure.

We shared the photos, the stories behind the photos - found common themes running through them and each wrote a monologue inspired by their picture, then we allowed the movement to emerge. I created phrases in response to the monologues and the dancers also improvised to find movement, interspersed together, the piece came to be.

I would like to thank all the dancers for their amazing work - it has been a real privilege to spend time and work with them.

CATHERINE YOUNG

Catherine Young is Dance Ireland's Associate Artist 2014/15 and Dancer in Residence for Kerry County Council co-funded by the Arts Council. She has been Dancer/Choreographer in Residence at Siamsa Tíre since 2006 where she is artistic director of CYD Dance, Kerry Youth Dance Theatre and co-curator of Tocht Dance Festival. Catherine holds an MA in Contemporary Dance from University Limerick where she is also a guest lecturer. Prior to this, she spent 8 years training and performing in San Francisco and has studied/worked with Printz Dance Project (USA), The American Conservatory Theatre (USA), Retina Dance Company (UK/Belgium), Lacina Coulibaly (Kongo Ba Teria Dance Company - Africa), Wendy Houstoun (UK) and Hofesh Schecter Company (UK) among others. Catherine is an Arts Council funded artist and has presented works at the Dublin Dance Festival, The Dublin Fringe Festival, Project Arts Centre, Firkin Crane, Wexford Opera House and the Pavilion Theatre.

Established in 2007 as part of CoisCéim BROADREACH, Creative Steps is a dance theatre group for young people aged 15-25. Based at CoisCéim Dance Theatre's studio in Dublin City Centre and coordinated by Broadreach Director Philippa Donnellan, it offers young people opportunity to collaborate, devise and perform dance theatre for the stage and the screen and work with guest choreographers, teachers, and professional artists in different mediums.

Central to the ethos of Creative Steps is to facilitate and enable young people to work inventively and imaginatively together – to take creative risks and explore the unknown – and to challenge themselves and others in the creation and performance of original, high quality dance theatre.

Over the past 7 years Creative Steps participants have produced a number of short dance films and theatre productions, and have performed both locally and nationally at festivals including: Big Bang Festival of Rhythm, Longford Dance Festival, NOISEmoves Youth Dance Festival, Irish Youth Dance Festival and Culture Night. In 2014 members worked with Philippa Donnellan to create and perform ARMY ANTS as part of CURTAIN RAISERS for CoisCéim Dance Theatre production of AGNES at Project Arts Centre.

Creative Steps is now open to new members to take part in a performance project from 19 January – 17 March 2015 directed by Muirne Bloomer for St Patrick's Festival 2015.
